



Tsunami kids' day out

CHENNAI: As fluorescent balls come dangerously close to bouncing off your head and excited squeals make yelling the only option for conversation, a young boy of eight marches up to you and thrusts a piece of imitation jewellery into your hands and says, "you're not doing anything right" and disappears into the crowd of kids.

It was one busy day last week. Shabnam Resources—a camp for the

It was one busy day last week. Shabnam Resources—a camp for the tsunami-affected children, is being conducted by international students associated with AIESEC, along with M.R. Hubert, Director of the Shabnam Resources. And it's chaos unlimited, as dumb charade seem to be the best method of communication. But then as Aurelien De Brunells, a student from France, puts it, "You don't need words to play games."

The brainchild of Victor Tsang, a member of the AIESEC from Hong Kong doing his internship in India, it's a "day-out" for the kids involving games, a trip to the Birla Planetarium and to top it all, souvenirs when they go back home. "I came to India because I wanted to do some volunteer service and I'm happy that's been possible", smiles Victor. "This is a great opportunity for these children to have a glimpse of the world outside as they get to play games from different countries", explains Klaus Lappe, one of the trustees of the Shabnam Resources, and indeed a

young girl dressed in a bright green pattu pavadai grins through the toilet paper wrapped to make her a "mummy".

As a global experience, the interaction has worked both ways. Aldo Tordoyo from Bolivia, training with an IT company learned English in India and is picking up Tamil from the kids. His other AIESEC buddy Edward Londono (Colombia) has worked with underprivileged children in his own country. "I want to continue working with Shabnam and organise more events", he says.

The young group isn't restricted to just AIESEC members though, both Aurelien and Sebastien Crouzet (France) got involved through friends in AIESEC while for Anna Maasalo (Finland) and Heloise Godfrey (Wales) the children's camp is a subject of interest. Both work with TeachIndia and have spent time in Nagapattinam training teachers there.

The children stream out to play the next game, throwing water balloons at an AIESEC volunteer. The global experience" seems complete.

The idea of creating a "Children's Home" was born out of the necessity to provide not only food, clothing, shelter, education and medical care to children in need but also to provide them the love and affection they equally need.

We shall not discriminate between race, creed, cast, religion, colour, or gender but shall consider neediness as the only criteria.

Our special care shall be provided to abused, tortured and/or stigmatic children.

The absolute necessity of such Children"s Home was confirmed by the fact that on the day we mentioned it we received 46 "applications"

After the death of his parents, little Kamaldas was taken by his uncle who held him responsible for their death.


The scars in his face and over his body are a sign of torture by this "uncle".

We Shall help him to recover soon.






